Week 37

Day 1

Read Titus 1

Notice why Paul is concerned that Titus find elders of good character and true faith?

Reflect

What would it feel like to be led by an elder with the bad qualities Paul describes? How would it feel different under an elder with the good traits he lists? Have you known examples of either?

Respond

Would you make a good elder according to Paul? What might you have to change in your life to better fit the description?

Pray

Thank God for the good leaders he has placed over you and pray for their integrity and faith. Ask God to show you what he wants to do in your life to make you into the kind of servant he desires.

Day 2

Read Titus 2

As you read this chapter, keep in mind that many Christians in Crete lived in homes with pagan husbands, fathers, or masters. What is Paul's advice for these Christians without social power?

Reflect

What can you learn here about living an upright life and treating those well who are in power over you? How would this behavior advance the gospel?

Respond

How will you change the way you treat and work with non-Christians who have power over you in your family, at work, or in society and non-Christians over whom you have power?

Pray

Pray for the grace and power to treat others well even when they treat you badly and do not share or respect your values and beliefs.

Day 3

Read Titus 3

Note the behaviors Paul encourages and those he condemns. What reasons does he give in each case?

Reflect

How does the work of God in your life described in verses 4-7 motivate you to follow Paul's guidelines? What have you read

here that indicates a need for change in your life?

Respond

Where has God shown mercy in your life? To whom do you need to show kindness and how?

Pray

Thank God for the mercy he has shown you and ask him to show you those who need kindness and display his goodness to them through you.

Day 4

Read Philemon

In this personal letter, Paul asks his friend Philemon to forgive and receive back Onesimus, his runaway slave, who now follows Christ. Pay attention to Paul's attitude toward Onesimus and his appeal to Philemon's Christian values.

Reflect

How do Paul's comments about himself reflect Christ's humility? How does Paul attempt to persuade Philemon to receive Onesimus when he could command him?

Respond

In what ways can you adopt a more humble posture to encourage others to freely choose the right path?

Pray

Praise God for the way his kingdom undoes evil human institutions. Seek his grace to act with humility toward those you influence.

Day 5

Read Hebrews 1

What truths does the author provide about the divinity and authority of Jesus?

Reflect

Why is it important to establish that Jesus is not just a powerful being, like an angel, but God's own son?

Respond

How do the descriptions of Christ's divinity and majesty encourage you to put confidence in him and lead you to rejoice in him? Imagine this kingly Christ writing a letter like Philemon to you, asking you to accept his brother. How would you respond?

Pray

How does it make you feel that the one who upholds the universe also made purification for your sins? Respond in thanks and worship.

Week 38

Day 1

Read Hebrews 2

Notice the description of the sacrifice Jesus made, the victory he obtained, and the position he now holds. What did Jesus accomplish?

Reflect

Why is Jesus not ashamed to call us brothers and sisters? How were we set free from the fear of death? Why can Jesus help us overcome temptations?

Respond

Do you need to come to Jesus as Savior to be rescued from the fear of death by which Satan holds you captive? Go to Jesus as one who has made Himself weak in order to struggle with the very sin that you deal with.

Pray

Thank Jesus for his sacrifice and ask the One who became perfect through suffering for help you deal with temptation.

Day 2

Read Hebrews 3

Why did God respond so strongly against their unbelieving grumbling hearts? In what way is Jesus superior to Moses? What is the author warning us about? Of what do we need to be confident?

Reflect

How did the Israelites fail God in the wilderness? Do you also find in yourself an unbelieving heart? Have you been tempted to doubt God's goodness or his help for you?

Respond

What must we do that we might not be led astray? How can we help others to maintain their confidence?

Pray

Thank God for sending Jesus who paid the penalty for your unbelieving heart. Confess times when sin has caused you to act in unbelief and ask God to strengthen your faith.

Day 3

Read Hebrews 4:1-13

Notice who enters God's rest and what that rest means. What power does the word of God have?

Reflect

What is the condition of your heart? How do obedience and faith work together to bring us to God's rest? Imagine what joining God in rest will be like.

Respond

How might you "make every effort to enter into God's rest"?

Let these words you've read reveal your inner thoughts and attitudes (verse 12).

Pray

Thank God for his grace working in your life through faith, rescuing you from your efforts to save yourself. Confess times of unbelief when you have worked through your own efforts rather than trusting in God.

Day 4

Read Hebrews 4:14- 5:10

Notice how Jesus can do Aaron's job and a lot more. What did he learn and experience that enables him to help us?

Reflect

Why did Jesus need to suffer? How is he acting as our High Priest? How did God answer when Jesus prayed? For what are we being urged to go to Jesus for help? How do we know he will understand and sympathize?

Respond

Visualize yourself coming before the heavenly throne of grace. Why do you have confidence to come?

Pray

Kneel beside Jesus as he prays to the Father. Seek the grace and mercy from Jesus he won for you. Thank him for his role of high priest in your life.

Day 5

Read Hebrews 5:11-6:12

Do these verses frighten you? What benefits do we have in Jesus and how have those described here failed to receive them?

Reflect

Why is the writer confident that we will find salvation? What fruit does he see in their lives? Do you see more than thorns and thistles in yours?

Respond

Verse 10 guarantees that God notices your love and the work you do for him. Consider how God has blessed your efforts to please him and help others.

Pray

Be willing for God to show you where you have produced thorns in your life and ask God to sharpen your hearing.

Week 39

Day 1

Read Hebrews 6:13-20

How is Abraham an example for us? Why might a promise God made to Abraham be important to us? If you have a moment, read the promise in Genesis 22:17 & 18.

Reflect

What is your hope? What promise do you find here? What strong encouragement has God given you as “an anchor to your soul”? Where has Jesus gone to represent you?

Respond

Think about what you know of Abraham’s story. How can you imitate his faith with the even greater hope our High Priest gives?

Pray

Ask God to give you the faith of Abraham to believe God’s promises even when you don’t see immediate fulfillment.

Day 2

Read Hebrews 7:1-14

The author as just told us that Jesus has become a High Priest in the order of Melchizedek. What do we learn about Jesus from this story about this unique priest and king?

Reflect

Why do we need a better priest than those in the order of Aaron?

If Melchizedek represents Jesus, why is it important to remember Abraham paid tithes to Melchizedek and was blessed by him?

Respond

How will you imitate Abraham as you respond to Jesus? With tithes and offerings? With worship and thanksgiving? With service to the Kingdom?

Pray

Pray that God will open your mind and your heart to what this story of Abraham and Melchizedek teaches about Jesus and your salvation.

Day 3

Read Hebrews 7:15-28

On what basis has Jesus become our High Priest (v. 16, 25-28)? Why is he a better hope than the old system?

Reflect

In what ways does Jesus fulfill this new priestly role? What are the significant differences between the old priestly system under the law, and Christ our High Priest? How does Jesus save us completely (v. 25)?

Respond

What did Jesus do and does Jesus do that allows you to come close to God? Why do you need to be close to him right now?

Pray

What characteristics of Jesus seem most significant to you in this passage? Praise Jesus for these, and for his work for you. Ask God to reveal Himself to you through prayer, Bible study, worship, and service.

Day 4

Read Hebrews 8

Where is the real tent, the true tabernacle? What is different about the new covenant God promised in Jeremiah 31?

Reflect

What was the purpose of the old tent and the old covenant? Why did they need to be replaced? Why is this new covenant so much better than the old?

Respond

Do you sometimes try to follow your own version of the law instead of trusting Jesus? Are you trying to please Jesus with a list of dos and don’ts? Take time to consider what it means to have God’s new covenant—the freedom we have in Christ—written in your heart and in your mind.

Pray

Praise God that you have been included in this new covenant with God’s people where your sins are remembered no more.

Day 5

Read Hebrews 9:1-10

Notice how much more complicated worship was before Jesus came. What can we learn from these rituals? Why did they not fully meet the needs of the worshipper?

Reflect

Think about how hard it was to get to God in this old tent under the old covenant. How is it easier for us without being less demanding? What difference does it make that Jesus died for us?

Respond

Turn what you’ve read on its head and think about all Jesus has provided as our High Priest and sacrifice. We’ll learn more later. If you have never accepted this gift from God, today is a good day to be set free!

Pray

Thank God for the amazing gift of forgiveness for your sins, and for the gift of new life you have been given by the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Week 40

Day 1

Read Hebrews 9:11–28

In what way is the sacrifice of Jesus better? Notice the things it gains for us. Can you find the three places Jesus appeared?

Reflect

Think about the wonder of God's plan. Ask yourself: Have I been dependent on my own efforts to try to make myself holy? How can I glorify God more by being utterly dependent on Jesus for freedom from the guilt of sin, for purity, and for my future hope?

Respond

From what acts that lead to death do I need to be cleansed? Where do I have a guilty conscience? By admitting that Jesus' sacrifice is enough, how can I better serve the Living God?

Pray

Lord, give me a better understanding of how when Jesus came on the scene he changed everything - in history, in my life, and for the future of the world.

Day 2

Read Hebrews 10:1–18

Notice what Christ came into the world to do and what he is waiting for now. How did it change everything?

Reflect

In verse 16, the author is repeating the quotation in verse 16. What is promised here? How has Jesus sanctified us, or made us holy? How has he perfected us for all times?

Respond

As you think about how things will be better when all Jesus' enemies are under his feet (v. 13) rejoice that your sins are already forgotten (v. 17).

Pray

Thank God for setting you apart for himself and writing his laws on your heart. Commit yourself to him for his work of making you holy.

Day 3

Read Hebrews 10:19–39

What gives us confidence and hope to enter into a relationship with God and stay in a relationship with him? What will be rewarded?

Reflect

In verses 22–24 what 3 things are we urged to do? In verses 32–36 look for the commands and decide which apply to you.

Respond

How can you encourage a brother or sister in Christ toward love and good deeds and meeting together? In what circumstances do you tend to shrink back? How can you find the encouragement you need to go forward in faith?

Pray

Ask God to help you live by faith and not shrink back! Pray for yourself and others that none will throw away confidence but will rather persevere, even in times of persecution.

Day 4

Read Hebrews 11

Notice the faith of these bible characters and how each one of them was commended. Pay attention to the definitions of faith in verses 1 and 6.

Reflect

Why do we need to have faith in order to please God? Choose one or two of these stories to meditate on. How has your faith journey been like theirs? What do you have they didn't?

Respond

What choices did these men and women of faith make that you can imitate? How can you share their perspective on life? What earthly treasures and ways of living and thinking can you let go of to make room for heavenly ones?

Pray

Pray for eyes of faith and ask the Lord for the persistence and commitment of these faith heroes.

Day 5

Read Hebrews 12:1–13

In verses 1-4, fix your eyes on the example of Jesus. Then consider how God disciplines us and how we should respond.

Reflect

Are there any ways in which you are growing weary and losing heart? Consider Jesus and all that he endured, as well as his final outcome of joy and triumph.

Respond

What is one step you can take to throw off a sin or hindrance that is keeping you from running your race for Jesus? Be encouraged and encourage others by reminding them God is forming his holiness in them.

Pray

Pray that you and others will run the race and not drop out! Ask God for strength and direction – to guide you on a level path.

Week 41

Day 1

Read Hebrews 12:14-29

Notice how the author continues to describe the path we must take and contrasts Sinai with the heavenly Zion.

Reflect

What do the symbols and descriptions of the two mountains in verses 18-24 mean for us? How do these images motivate us to follow the path verses 14-17 and 25-29 describe?

Respond

How may you express gratitude for the kingdom we've been given? How will you avoid bitterness and seek peace with others?

Pray

Imagine Mount Zion, your hope and citizenship, and pray as the Spirit leads. What kind of worship does this vision of the heavenly Jerusalem call for?

Day 2

Read Hebrews 13

Notice the 4 pairs of admonitions in verses 1-6, and the other calls to obedience (cf. vv. 9, 17) and how Jesus' death is described.

Reflect

In what way should we follow the models of previous and present leaders of the church and of Jesus? When might we be called to share Christ's disgrace? What does the benediction (vv. 20 & 21) tell us we need? How can our praise become a sacrifice?

Respond

Does your attitude toward others who may be good examples for you need to change? Should you ask them for help? How can you follow Christ's example and join him outside the camp bearing his disgrace?

Pray

Ask the Father to teach you to imitate the example of his Son. Pray for others with the guidance of verses 18-21.

Day 3

Read James 1:1-18

Notice how we are to deal with trouble and temptation and what you can learn about God's character and attitude towards us.

Reflect

God is still with us even when we feel abandoned. What kind of faith do we need to gain the crown of life? Where do we get it and how do we use it? What sort of wisdom do you need now?

Respond

When troubles or temptations come, what attitude will you take towards God and the threat you face? Reflect on how Jesus has helped you in the past.

Pray

Ask God for wisdom, strength and good gifts to deal with the tests and troubles you are facing now and might face tomorrow.

Day 4

Read James 1:19-27

Notice what we need to do to receive the word of God into our hearts and lives. If we don't do what we hear are we listening?

Reflect

Why is listening to others more important than telling them what to do? When have you answered too quickly? What have you been seeing about yourself as you've been looking into the mirror of God's word?

Respond

How will you listen to others better? What will you do about what you saw in the mirror? How will you be set free if you do these things?

Pray

Ask God to make you a better listener. Humbly thank Jesus you've been set free, confess the wrongs the mirror has shown you and commit yourself to action.

Day 5

Read James 2:1-13

Notice how living faith is further defined, what the royal law is, and how that law is applied. Find words that describe how to love and how not to love.

Reflect

What is required for us to be rich in faith? How do these verses reflect both what Jesus said and what he did? Why does James say the law gives freedom?

Respond

When Jesus came to this earth, he came for the poor, the sick, the needy and those searching. He spent time with them without judging them. How will you choose to imitate Jesus and obey the law of liberty in a new way?

Pray

Ask God to give you a vision and compassion for those less fortunate than yourself. Ask him to show you when you do what's described in verse 4 and what you should do instead.

Week 42

Day 1

Read James 2:14-26

Notice what kind of faith is alive and those who are examples of this faith. How would you distinguish between belief and faith? If you are uncertain about what James is arguing, look carefully at verses 17, 20 & 26.

Reflect

How does James suggest we might show our faith is alive? Was Abraham justified and called a friend of God because of what he did? What did the actions of Abraham and Rahab demonstrate? How do you live out your faith?

Respond

Choose one of the stories in these verses and determine to imitate it – or avoid it!

Pray

If faith is what we do, not just what we believe, what might you expect if you asked God to make your faith bigger? Ask.

Day 2

Read James 3

Can you find six illustrations of the point James is making? Do you notice two kinds of wisdom? What are they?

Reflect

Each pair of illustrations seems to say something different about the tongue. What are those three lessons? What solution to the problem of the tongue do you find in the verses on wisdom?

Respond

How will you use your tongue more safely and wisely? What benefits might you expect from this?

Pray

Pray for a change of heart where you need it in order to sow peace and harvest righteousness (v. 18) instead of lighting forest fires.

Day 3

Read James 4

How is being a friend of the world being defined? What do you need to do to draw near to God? What should your attitude be towards tomorrow? (vv. 13-17)

Reflect

What does it mean in verse 8 to cleanse your hands? (Think about what we do with our hands!) Why isn't that enough? Why is double-mindedness opposed to a pure heart? Why is

humility necessary?

Respond

How will you submit yourself and your future to God today? Does covetousness, pride or arrogance stand your the way?

Pray

Based on this passage, what will you ask for and what should you not ask for?

Day 4

Read James 5

For what are rich people condemned? What is the nature of the patience in verses 7-11? Does your translation have two do not's? What does James say about prayer for the sick?

Reflect

How is your lifestyle different from these rich people James condemns? How many contrasts can you find between the evil rich man and the farmer (v. 7)? Why should we pray no matter how we feel?

Respond

Do you need to work on verse 12? How will you follow the examples of Job and Elijah? Is there a sin you need to confess to someone? Is there a wanderer you might try to restore?

Pray

Use verse 13 to guide you. Are there confessions you need to make? Should you seek the help of others when praying for the healing you need?

Day 5

Read 1 Peter 1:1-12

Notice what is said about the Author, purpose, future, and power of our salvation. How are we protected? Why do we have this hope?

Reflect

What sort of a test do troubles give to the faith God gave you? What will the outcome be? How are you able to love Jesus since you can't see him?

Respond

List the many reasons for joy. Prepare yourself to be motivated by these to obey what you will read in 1 Peter by faith and out of love.

Pray

Give thanks to God for your salvation using these verses.

Week 43

Day 1

Read 1 Peter 1:13-2:3

What does Peter say about our relationship to God and other believers? In what ways should we act like children and babies? How are we to be holy?

Reflect

How does what we do with our mind and soul prepare us for holy living and love for others? What motivation in the work of Jesus do you find here for right living?

Respond

Notice what Peter has to say about God's word and allow these words you've read to instruct and strengthen you. "Set your hope fully on the grace of God."

Pray

Pray that God would work in your mind and soul so that you will live a holy life, love others deeply and "grow up to salvation."

Day 2

Read 1 Peter 2:4-17

How are we described in these verses? What should each of the three sets of description motivate us to do? What happens if we submit to authority and do good?

Reflect

What does it mean to offer spiritual sacrifices? What can we proclaim about the one who called us out of darkness? What constitutes honorable conduct?

Respond

What spiritual sacrifices do you need to make? How will you proclaim the excellencies or praises of Jesus? With what passions do you need to do battle?

Pray

Praise God for your unique identity in Jesus and ask help for the responses you've determined to make.

Day 3

Read 1 Peter 2:18-3:7

Consider what you can learn as a spouse, employee, or someone who has trouble being under someone else's authority.

Reflect

Give some thought to how to apply what you've read to our time and culture. How will you choose to follow the model of Christ's life portrayed here? How might your interactions with others draw them to Jesus?

Respond

Choose one or two pieces of instruction you wish learn to apply to your life and decide how you will put these into action.

Pray

Ask God's blessing on those with whom you have difficulties and those to whom you are responsible. Ask God to bless them through you.

Day 4

Read 1 Peter 3:8-22

What should we do if we want to love life and be blessed? How is Christ a good example for us when we're treated badly?

Reflect

Which of the things Peter urges us to do would be most helpful to you right now? Under what conditions can we be confident of God's blessing even when we suffer?

Respond

If someone attacks your faith, how will you react? How are you blessed if you suffer for doing what is right?

Pray

Pray that God would help you to live in with a good conscience, in harmony with others, and to pursue peace, doing good with hope in Christ.

Day 5

Read 1 Peter 4

Notice how suffering can change a person's life for the better, why we need self-control, and what is most important. Pay attention to the teaching about gifts.

Reflect

How is rejoicing while sharing the sufferings of Jesus different from just experiencing suffering? What sufferings do we bring on ourselves? How are we instructed to use our gifts? Why do you think we should we not be surprised if trials come along to test us?

Respond

How will you handle suffering that comes your way? In response to what you just read, what will you seek to develop, embrace and avoid? What attitude should you develop?

Pray

Pray that God would help you to rejoice in him during times of suffering, be clear minded and self-controlled and love others deeply.

Week 44

Day 1

Read 1 Peter 5

If you are in leadership, spend some time reflecting on verses 1-4. Notice the importance here of humility and instructions about handling anxiety. Focus on the manual for battle with the roaring lion.

Reflect

Why are verses 5 thru 8 important for winning spiritual battles? Discover the promises you can hang on to.

Respond

What weaknesses can you identify that put you in danger? What strengths do you need to develop? What leaders are you in a position to encourage?

Pray

Pray for the shepherds of the flock and for personal and corporate victory over our adversary. Ask God's aid in what you have determined to grow out of and into.

Day 2

Read 2 Peter 1:1-11

Notice what we are called to and the purpose of God's precious promises. What seven qualities make us fruitful? If we live that way, what can we be sure of?

Reflect

If we are called to God's own glory and excellence and to partake of his divine nature, then how do these verses tell us we can be like God?

What motivation can you find here for godliness?

Respond

Which of these qualities do you need to work on? How will verses 3 & 4 guide you? What promises will you count on?

Pray

Ask God for his divine power so you may grow in faith, goodness, knowledge, self-control, perseverance, godliness, kindness and love.

Day 3

Read 2 Peter 1:12-21

Notice why Peter is writing to them. What two kinds of evidence does he have for Jesus' majesty, and which is stronger? Why can we trust the Bible?

Reflect

How can you do what Peter models here? Why is it important

to be certain about Jesus? According to verse 19, what will happen if you pay attention to what the Bible says?

Respond

Who can you stir up with a reminder to be fruitful in the knowledge of Jesus? How could you supplement the study you've been doing by learning more about Jesus from the Old Testament?

Pray

Ask God that the Bible, the word of the prophets, would be a light to you daily. Praise Jesus for his majesty and glory.

Day 4

Read 2 Peter 2

What point is Peter making by telling the stories of Noah, Lot and Balaam? How do these false prophets take advantage of people and what will happen to them?

Reflect

How does God deal with these false prophets and how do they get themselves in trouble? What is their wrong idea about freedom in Christ?

Respond

How do the warnings mentioned by Peter affect you now? Do false teachers distress you as much as they bothered Peter?

Pray

Ask God to help you to stand firm in your faith and in true Christian freedom. Pray that God would rescue you from trials and false teaching.

Day 5

Read 2 Peter 3

Why did Peter write this letter? How do people argue that Jesus will not come back in judgment? What do they ignore? How will this world end and what can we expect after that?

Reflect

How are God's patience and his view of time a benefit to us and others? How does Peter encourage Christians to live holy lives? What should motivate us?

Respond

What steps will you take to defend yourself against these false teachers? What can you do to be holy and godly?

Pray

Thanks Jesus that he's coming back, and that he's patient. Ask God to help you understanding the truth and "grow in the grace and knowledge" of Jesus.

Week 45

Day 1

Read 1 John 1

What is true about God as revealed in Jesus? Notice the kinds of relationships we can enjoy as believers. What are two lies which keep us from a relationship with God or other people?

Reflect

What light does John have to share with us? What happens when we live in that light? How can we know we've been cleansed from our sins?

Respond

What sins must you confess? How can you continue to live in the light? How can you enjoy your fellowship with the Father and the Son?

Pray

Ask God for the confidence to confess your sins and to live in the light. Ask him to help you hold on to the word of life and his promise to cleanse you from everything you've done wrong.

Day 2

Read 1 John 2:1-17

How do we know our sins are forgiven? How is love for God made complete in us? What is the new commandment?

Reflect

When can we say we really know Jesus and have God's love in us? Find two evidences. How can we live like Jesus? What does John say is true about us? Find at least four things.

Respond

Lay your sins before the Advocate. Let verse 16 guide you. What can you do to make sure you are in the light and God's love is in you?

Pray

Praise God that if you do sin, Jesus Christ, who has God's full approval, speaks on your behalf when you come into the presence of the Father.

Day 3

Read 1 John 2:18-29

What truth about Jesus do you find in these verses? Notice how you can be sure of this truth. How can we identify antichrists? How can we know we abide in Christ?

Reflect

What is the source of your knowledge about Jesus? Why are these truths important? How can you find confidence and know you have been born of God?

Respond

Seek the Holy Spirit for assurance of the identity of Jesus and your identity in him? Go to Jesus for the confidence you need and cling to him.

Pray

Thank God for the Holy Spirit's witness to the truth about Jesus. Worship him as the Messiah and the Son of God. Ask him for his righteousness.

Day 4

Read 1 John 3:1-10

Look at verses 1-2 to find your identity and your hope. If you have this hope, what will you do and how will you do it? What lie of Satan is John refuting here and what is the truth?

Reflect

What prevents us from continuing to live sinful lives? What difference does it make if you have been born of God and what are the evidences that you are reborn?

Respond

What can you do now to prepare for the day when Christ appears? If you are going to be like him, what needs to change or be purified?

Pray

Ask God's help to receive all the love he has for you and to love others with that love.

Day 5

Read 1 John 3:11-24

Notice that Jesus is our primary model for loving others. Pay attention to four things we should know and understand (see verses 14, 16, 19, & 24).

Reflect

Think about the contrast between Cain and Christ. How is the world around us like Cain? How can we find assurance for our hearts when we feel condemned?

Respond

How are we to imitate Jesus? What and who will you depend on when you lack confidence concerning your relationship with God? Is God more merciful toward you than you are towards yourself?

Pray

Thank Jesus for his love and the assurance of your salvation and a place in his heart. Ask for confidence in his love and ways to love others.

Week 46

Day 1

Read 1 John 4:1-6

John has already given tests for recognizing the spirits of antichrist. They will deny that Jesus is the Christ and his relationship to the Father (2:22), or will not practice righteousness (3:7) or show brotherly love (3:10). What test does he mention here?

Reflect

Why have we overcome these spirits? Who listens to them? Who listens to us? What do you read and listen to each day and how does that inform your worldview and attitude?

Respond

Are you letting it bother you when people do not agree with you about faith and morality and everyone says they are right? What should you do?

Pray

Pray that you will recognize the signs of false spirits and of the Spirit of God. Praise God for his light and life.

Day 2

Read 1 John 4:7-21

How many times is the word /love/ used? What does John say about God's love and about our love? What evidences should we look for to be assured that God abides in us?

Reflect

What is the relationship between God's love for us and our love for others? How does God's love motivate us and grow in us? What gives us confidence?

Respond

Accept God's love for you that it might overcome your fears. Then let it flow out to others.

Pray

Praise God for His sacrificial, all-encompassing, renewing love. Pray that God will give you the heart of Jesus for those you have trouble loving.

Day 3

Read 1 John 5

These verses repeat and summarize most of what you have been reading in 1 John. Look for truths about faith, love, and obedience and instructions that have been meaningful to you.

Reflect

What are you learning about love, confidence, the work of

the Spirit, truth, and the person of Jesus? How can you help others who struggle with these things?

Respond

If you have not accepted the life Jesus offers, would you do so now? If you have, how will you rely on it more and live it better? What do you need to ask for now that is in God's will?

Pray

Thank God for what you've learned about Jesus and love and ask him to give you the love and faith you need..

Day 4

Read 2 John

Look for words that are repeated. Which words are pointing to the same idea or ideal? What is John teaching using these words?

Reflect

What are the tensions between the truth or Christ's teaching in this passage and deception? Why is love important?

Respond

What teachings, messages, and attitudes in today's world counteract Christ's teaching? How can you protect yourself from deception?

Pray

Pray for wisdom to discern truth and practice love. Pray for God to build up our church in truth and to keep us and our children walking in the truth as we are exposed to new ideas.

Day 5

Read 3 John

In the early church, it was customary to offer hospitality to traveling Christian workers as they visited a local community. How does Gaius help these workers?

Reflect

What do you learn about Gaius' leadership in the church? What do you learn about Diotrephes' leadership? How would you apply this to situations today?

Respond

How can you become involved in encouraging workers and missionaries from Vineyard and elsewhere? How can you learn more about ministries that interest you?

Pray

Pray for those who share the Gospel as their vocation. Pray for God's provision for them. Ask God how you can show hospitality and generosity to these brothers and sisters.

Week 47

Day 1

Read Jude 1-16

Notice the purpose Jude has for writing this letter and the things the false teachers are doing wrong (verses 3, 4, 8 & 16). What lessons can we learn from the stories he tells?

Reflect

How is Michael's behavior contrasted with that of the evil angels? How would you describe in a couple of words the evil actions and coming punishment of the ungodly people described here?

Respond

Do you see any wrong action and attitude described here that you also see in yourself or in people whose influence you should avoid?

Pray

Ask God to show you if there is anyone or anything that is perverting His grace in your life. Pray earnestly for His help to contend for the faith with which you have been entrusted.

Day 2

Read Jude 17-25

Notice our three lines of defense against these scoffers with ungodly passions. How are we to help others while protecting ourselves?

Reflect

How will you keep yourself in the love of God? What is God able to do? What specific characteristics of false teachers does Jude tell us to watch for?

Respond

Imagine the glorious day when you will stand joyfully and pure before God. Let that motivate you to build yourself up in the faith. Can you think of anyone you might help to escape from these lies and perversions?

Pray

Thank God for his power to keep you from stumbling. Commit yourself to remain in his love. Ask Him to have mercy on those who are lost around you.

Day 3

Read Revelation 1

Notice how Jesus is described how he describes himself, and what he plans to do (vv. 4-8). How did this letter come to be written? (vv. 9-11)

Reflect

What do you think Jesus means to communicate to us by

appearing in the way he did to John? (vv. 12-16) How is way he looks explained by what he says next? (vv. 17-20)

Respond

How do John and Jesus describe the message of this book? (vv. 1, 19). What do you find in these verses that gives you hope and courage?

Pray

Praise Jesus for holding everything in his hands. Request insight from God to understand the words of Revelation and to take them to heart. Ask Him for faith to trust Him in the unknown.

Day 4

Read Revelation 2:1-17

What does Jesus know about each of these churches and what does he like? Notice what he has against the church in Ephesus and the one in Pergamum.

Reflect

Can you identify in your own life any of the things Jesus commends or criticizes? As you think about the symbols in each promise Jesus gives, what do they call to your mind?

Respond

Do you hear the Spirit speaking to you? Which church do you most identify with? How does Jesus correct or encouraging you in what he says and what will you do about it?

Pray

Commit yourself to sound teaching, patient endurance, faithfulness and love as the Spirit has convicted you.

Day 5

Read Revelation 2:18-3:6

For what is the church at Thyatira commended? What kinds of bad teaching do you think Jesus is referring to with the symbols he uses? What amazing promise does he give them?

Reflect

Why does Jesus describe himself as he does to each of these churches? What does Jesus do and what is he going to do? How might works be incomplete in God's sight? (3:1).

Respond

2:23 states that Jesus searches hearts and minds. Is there something you are trying to hide from God? Of what do you need to repent?

Pray

Put your life in the hands of Jesus as he has described himself here. Put yourself under his protection and commit yourself to a greater vision and ministry.

Week 48

Day 1

Read Revelation 3:7-22

What is the path to success for those with little strength which Jesus shows to the church in Philadelphia? What illusion is the church in Laodicea living under?

Reflect

How might we look at our own relationship with Jesus in light of these verses? Is there any evidence of being lukewarm? If so, can we still find hope?

Respond

What are the active words used to describe the responses Jesus is seeking from these churches? What measures do these verses suggest you take to avoid being fooled into complacency?

Pray

Pray for the Holy Spirit to reveal any hidden areas of complacency. Ask for strength to hold on to the crown promised to you. Pray for wisdom and guidance in seeking the honors of heaven.

Day 2

Read Revelation 4

Where are we, and when does this drama take place? What is happening? How is God represented and how is he described?

Reflect

What do the symbols in this vision of the heavenly temple tell you about God? What is revealed about our future worship? Why should God be worshipped in this way?

Respond

Are any of these acts of worship particularly meaningful to you? How might you use this chapter as a guide for your personal worship? How do these images help you to praise God?

Pray

Pray for God's Holy Spirit to become a greater part of your daily worship and your time spent with God. Ask for more creativity in how you come before God, seeking new ways to express your gratitude for who he is and all he has done.

Day 3

Revelation 5

Why is John upset? How is Jesus described and what symbols represent him? How is he worshipped? What is he worthy to do and why? What had Jesus done for us, and what is in our future?

Reflect

Why does Jesus deserve worship both as Lion (v. 5) and Lamb (vv. 6, 12)? Why is Jesus worthy to open this scroll?

Respond

What ought you to do as a priest to our God and part of his kingdom? How can you find your identity in this?

Pray

Ask Jesus to help you to know him more fully, reveling in his sacrifice for you and his victory over sin and death. Choose words from this chapter of Revelation to worship the Lamb.

Day 4

Revelation 6

Some see Jesus in verses 1-2, and some see war. What events that you experience or hear about in the news are represented by the next three seals, verses 3-8? How do you understand the symbols in verses 12-16?

Reflect

Are you impatient for Christ's return like those in verses 9-11? Why do we need to wait? What hope or comfort do you find in this chapter? Do you look forward to God's judgment of the world?

Respond

What should your attitude be when you experience or hear of horrible things happening on this earth that take away peace? Who is in charge?

Pray

Praise God that he's in control, and ask for help to endure the hardships and pain of this life. Pray for wisdom to understand God's purposes in this world.

Day 5

Revelation 7

How is the crowd in verse 9 described? What will we do when we enter the throne room in heaven? What will Jesus do for us when he comes again? (vv. 15-17)

Reflect

Have you "washed your robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb" (v. 14). Since you have God's seal, can you already experience what is promised for your future?

Respond

Do we have to postpone the worship described in verses 9-12 until we get to heaven? Notice the description of God in verse 12. How can you praise God for each thing mentioned?

Pray

Since God's plan is to involve every nation in salvation, pray for opportunities to share Jesus with the world, both locally and abroad. Ask for guidance in how best to approach God in worship during times of suffering.

Week 49

Day 1

Read Revelation 8:1-5

What effect does our prayer have in heaven? Why do you think John speaks of “silence in heaven”? What might that point to?

Reflect

What do you think will happen when these angels blow their trumpets? What are trumpets used for? What encouragement might you find here if you feel God is not listening to you?

Respond

How does it make you feel to know that when you pray an angel offers incense before God? Does this passage give you a reason to pray big prayers for this world?

Pray

Seek confidence from God that he is in control. Feel free to ask him to urge the angels to blow their trumpets soon, but ask him what you should be doing while you wait.

Day 2

Read Revelation 8:6-13

What happens when each of these trumpets are blown? Do these images remind you of anything that is happening today or has happened in the past?

Reflect

How would you recognize the events symbolized here if they happened? What message do you hear in verse 13? With all these warnings, should you expect your life to be without trouble and our nation a land of peace and safety forever?

Respond

Think over what is precious in your life and determine to value God's purposes for this world and the future.

Pray

Praise God that your life has been relatively free from these horrors so far. Ask God to prepare you for troubles should they come and create in you a right attitude.

Day 3

Revelation 9:1-12

Who might this star be, and what is he doing? Look at verse 11 for a clue. Who are these things happening to? (v. 4) When and where have people experienced things like this?

Reflect

What is the real nature and purpose of Satan? Why would God allow him to do such things? Why would Satan bring pain to his own followers? Since demons are spirits, what are we being told here by these descriptions?

Respond

Do we need to fear Satan or anything his army does? What comfort can you bring to non-believers experiencing chronic hardships, disease, enmity, or insecurity?

Pray

Ask God to turn to himself the hearts of people you know through the troubles Satan brings upon them.

Day 4

Revelation 9:13-21

Notice what people are said to be doing in verses 20 and 21. What demonic things do people worship? How might the events here be an inevitable judgment for such worship?

Reflect

How is this world not like the world God created and how has our rebellion ruined it? Do you believe God designed the horrible things that happen in this world to call people to repentance? Why don't they repent and turn to him?

Respond

Is there some idolatry or immoral practice for which you need to repent? What have you stolen from God or other people?

Pray

Praise God that everything we experience comes from the altar of God. Seek his assurance concerning fears you may have about the future.

Day 5

Read Revelation 10

Who do you think this angel is? How does his appearance point to the power he has and the importance of his message?

Reflect

How do we go about “eating the scroll”? Do you find comfort in the statement that there will be no more delay? What can that mean? What do you know about God's plan that is a mystery to those who don't believe?

Respond

John was to keep what the seven thunders said a secret. How will you deal with your desire to know and understand everything? After these studies are over are you making plans to continue eating well?

Pray

Commit yourself to believe what God has promised even if it is bitter in your stomach and trust him for what he doesn't explain. Praise him for the honey.

Week 50

Day 1

Read Revelation 11:1-14

These are symbols from the Old Testament you probably don't have time to study today, but can you find the church? What sort of power do the witnesses have? What happens to them when the beast kills them?

Reflect

Can anything defeat the witness of the church? Does the drought and fire remind you of an Old Testament story? Why is fire coming out of their mouths?

Respond

If the word of God has power to torment people and to bring them light and life how will you use it? Do you ever think of the fear people may have when they see the power of God at work in us?

Pray

Ask God to use your words and the words of other witnesses to bring fear and conviction. Seek for courage to live and speak as a true lamp. Pray for those who witness in dangerous places.

Day 2

Read Revelation 11:15-19

What happens when the last trumpet is blown? How will we praise God then? How are the enemies of God described here?

Reflect

Why are the nations upset? Are you glad that God is angry with them? What reward do you expect we will receive? When you look into God's temple, what do you see?

Respond

How will you live by the hope given us here? What kind of praise will you give when Christ returns?

Pray

Praise God that the time described here is coming! Ask him to give you the perspective and values of his coming kingdom.

Day 3

Read Revelation 12

Notice the sequence of past events in verses 1-9. Pay attention to who is on the throne in verse 10. Who are the major actors in this drama? What happened in heaven? When do you think that happened? What is the dragon doing now?

Reflect

What is our cause for joy in verses 10-12? How do verses 13-16 give us confidence? Where is the male child and what is he doing?

Respond

How do we conquer? What kind of commitment does this take? How will you spread your wings and fly to a place to be nourished?

Pray

Ask God to make his kingdom a reality in your experience, and that he would manifest more of his Spirit and will in your life.

Day 4

Read Revelation 13:1-10

If we had time we could find this monster in the Old Testament. Who gives it power? Who worships this beast, and why? What is the extent of its authority? How does our enemy operate?

Reflect

Who is this beast imitating? Why do people trust him? Who lets this enemy of God do what it does and why? What are we called upon to do? Why can we be brave?

Respond

Has there been persecution in your life? Has it made it hard to remain faithful? Where will you find strength to fight against this godless world?

Pray

Ask God for endurance and faith and to remind you that he's still in control.

Day 5

Read Revelation 13:11-18

Who gives this beast authority? What is it trying to do? What do you think this creature represents? How does it attempt to control the world?

Reflect

Is this beast really a lamb? Why might people think it is? What words here show us the truth about this beast? What does this creature tell us to do? What do the marks on hands and foreheads represent?

Respond

Who allows this beast to do what he does? When you notice who is tagged with this number, what will you do? What keeps you strong?

Pray

Ask God to help you not be deceived by the tricks of Satan's representatives or intimidated by their power but rather to stand strong.

Week 51

Day 1

Read Revelation 14:1-13

In these verses, John sees two visions in this drama of Revelation. Where is the first scene set? Who are there and what are they doing? In the second scene what are the three angels announcing? What is the last message in verses 12-13?

Reflect

Do you know any of the worshippers in the first scene? Are you one of them? In the second scene, where do you find yourself? What is required of you?

Respond

Perhaps you noticed that like the beast, God also marks his people. How do you react to that? Is his purpose the same? What praise can you give?

Pray

Follow the directions in verse 7. Praise God that you bear his mark. Ask God to sanctify you and make you blameless so you can more fully share in his kingdom.

Day 2

Read Revelation 14:14-15:4

A scene of judgment (14:14-20) is followed by an announcement of the seven plagues. After that, comes praise. Where are these scenes set? For what is God being praised?

Reflect

How does God's justice go hand in hand with his righteousness? Why do we need to know what is revealed here? Do you need to wait until we get to heaven to offer this praise?

Respond

What stirs your heart in this passage? How do you feel about the coming judgment? Are you able to join in the praise? What does the fear of God mean to you?

Pray

Use verses 3 & 4 to direct your prayer. Pray that all nations will come to worship God through Jesus. Lay before him anything here you find difficult to accept.

Day 3

Read Revelation 15:5-16:21

Notice what each bowl contains and how final these judgments are. Notice the reactions of people.

Reflect

Can you find here four plagues God sent on Egypt? What's the point of making these connections? What purpose does God have in these judgments? Who is suffering? What do they do and refuse to do? Who is getting ready for battle?

Respond

Can you praise God for his true and just judgments? How does it help when we know the strategy of the enemy? How will you stay awake and dressed (v. 15)?

Pray

Bless God and ask him to search your heart for any rebellious attitudes. Commit yourself to hold on to the promise of true justice to come.

Day 4

Read Revelation 17

Here's a new character in John's drama. If you can figure out what the beast is, you will have an idea who this woman is. The first readers knew the mystery about her name. Who do you think she is? Who are impressed by her?

Reflect

Does the great prostitute still exist today? What is her identity? If everyone is awed by her, why is she hated and destroyed by them? What does this tell you about any power or nation that sets itself up against the Lion who is a Lamb?

Respond

How does what this woman represents attract you? How can you remember where she came from, that she's enthroned in a wilderness, and what her true nature is?

Pray

Ask God to protect you from the seduction of this deceiver and defeat the purposes of our true enemy disguised all around you.

Day 5

Read Revelation 18

Try to notice quickly in this description of Babylon things you recognize from the world you live in. What are you told to do and why? What will happen to Babylon? Does she expect it? How are people reacting?

Reflect

Now go back and look at the first few verses. Verse 3 refers to luxurious living. Some translate this as debauchery. How are we drawn by wealth and privilege? Verse 4 says if we share in her sins we will also share in her plagues.

Respond

How do we go about coming out of Babylon? (v. 4) Why should we celebrate the judgment of Babylon, and why should we mourn?

Pray

Ask God to help you escape Babylon and rejoice in the goodness and love in his justice.

Week 52

Day 1

Read Revelation 19:1-10

John hears four shouts of "Hallelujah!" What do the first two celebrate? What is the great multitude celebrating with the last "Hallelujah!" (vv. 6-8)?

Reflect

Who is the bride at this wedding feast and what is she wearing? How can we make ourselves ready for this eternal celebration? Who will give the church the privilege of wearing that white robe?

Respond

Thank God that you are part of Christ's body, his bride, and that he reigns. Make yourself ready and take the clothes of righteousness God gives.

Pray

"Hallelujah!"

Day 2

Read Revelation 19:11-21

What three individuals does John see (vv. 11-16; 17-18, 19-21)? What do each of these visions mean? How is Jesus described? What does Jesus do? How does it all end?

Reflect

This is the beginning of the last part of the story. We'll learn a little more about the last judgment tomorrow. Today, focus on Jesus. If you've been joining us regularly in Eating Well, how would you summarize what has happened in Revelation so far?

Respond

We've been told of this battle before in 14:14-20 and 17:12-14. We'll see it one more time in the next chapter. Have you been looking forward to it? Are you ready to shout, "King of kings and Lord of lords"?

Pray

Take some time to fall in love with Jesus again. Thank God for the victory to come and praise him for what you know will come next.

Day 3

Read Revelation 20

Notice that God is again revealing the enemy's plans and countering with his own. There are three visions here beginning with "Then I saw..." What happens in each one?

Reflect

How can Satan be bound now and still do so much? Who is in control? When did you come alive from the dead? (v. 4) Does that mean you can't look forward to a physical resurrection on the day

of judgment? We have come to the end of this story before and seen what happens when Satan is set free for a few moments!

Respond

What does reviewing these events stir in you? Are you encouraged to know you are reigning with Christ? Are you glad that judgment is coming?

Pray

Thank God for his mighty plan. Ask him how to apply this knowledge to how you live day to day.

Day 4

Read Revelation 21

What does John see, and what do all these images mean? Who is the bride which is this holy city coming down from heaven? Why are its gates open?

Reflect

What is the water we will drink? Why is the city so big and fancy? How might earthly glories be a part of this Jerusalem? Why doesn't it need a temple?

Respond

How does having this city as your goal prepare you for all Revelation says you might have to go through? What things about this picture encourage you most?

Pray

If you are in the Lamb's book of life, rejoice! Celebrate with your savior that you will live with him forever.

Day 5

Read Revelation 22

Notice this passage starts and ends with the water of life? What promises do you find in between? How do these verses complete everything God has promised throughout the Bible?

Reflect

Do you remember a tree like this in the Garden of Eden? What does it promise? What assurance does John give us that these things he has recorded are true? Jesus himself also speaks! How does he confirm the truth of this book?

Respond

What do you hope to do after Jesus comes back? Has your tour of Revelation changed your perspective? Want to start your eternal celebration now?

Pray

Praise Jesus for his promise to bring the kingdom of heaven to the new earth! Thank him for his promise to live with us! Praise God, he has included us in the inheritance of Christ!
